

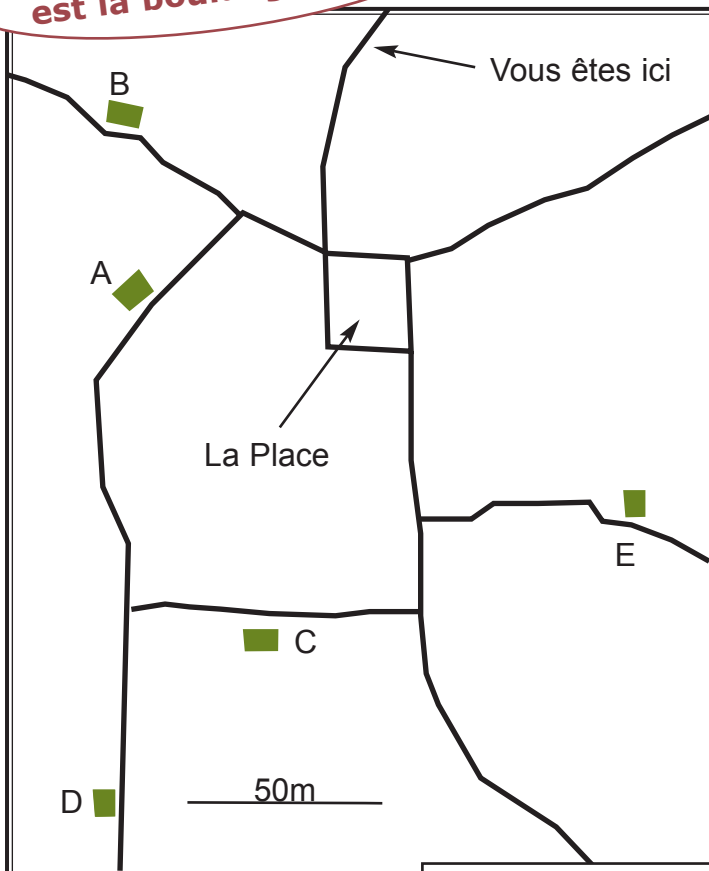

Shops

Shops usually open from 8am to midday then 2pm to 7pm. Shops in big cities may stay open at lunchtime. Most shops will be closed on Sundays and Mondays, although an increasing number are now opening on these days too.

Banks

Most banks are open Monday to Friday, some are open on Saturday too. The main banks in France are La Poste (which is also the post office), le Crédit Agricole, la Banque Nationale de Paris (BNP Paribas)...

Public holidays

The main holidays in France are in the summer. Everything shuts down in August: factories, shops, offices. Even Paris can seem very quiet in August. There are several public holidays throughout the year, mostly saints' days, which can fall on any day of the week.
